















Training and Technical Assistance Resources for Health Centers Serving Agricultural Workers

The Farmworker Health Network (FHN) is composed of six National Training and Technical Assistance Partners (NTTAPs) that focus on Migratory and Seasonal Agricultural Worker (MSAW) health: Farmworker Justice (FJ), MHP Salud, Health Outreach Partners (HOP), National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC), Migrant Clinicians Network (MCN), and the National Center for Farmworker Health (NCFH). These NTTAPs provide coordinated training and technical assistance (T/TA) to health centers that serve MSAWs. Each NTTAP within the network brings expertise in areas such as clinical support, outreach services, governing boards, and program development.


